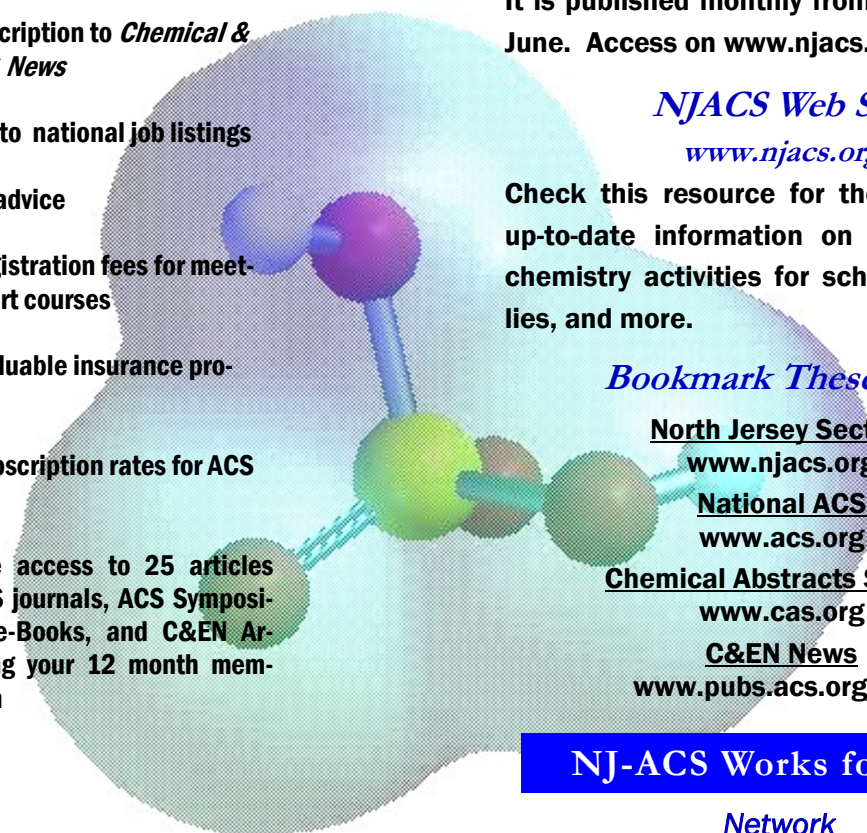

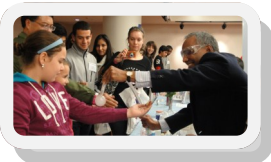
Who We Are; What We Do

In addition to the topical groups listed, the section also sponsors several groups that offer programming and activities tailored for chemists with special interests. There are a variety of activities for woman chemists, student members, chemists with disabilities, minority chemists, educators and younger chemists. Reduced membership rates are available for students; \$26/yr for undergraduates and \$73/yr for graduate students.
